Program Announcement

The Lexington Citizens' Academy begins its ninth year in September and runs through early December. The program is designed to expose residents to the various Town departments so they can gain a better understanding of how municipal government works. Through presentations, discussions, and visits to Town departments, participants have the opportunity to hear from various Directors and Managers and learn about the operations of Town programs and services. It is intended as a two-way dialogue between Town staff and residents. Participants discover new opportunities for public involvement and the role they can play in Town government. Topics include Schools, Public Works, Police Services, the Town Budget, Recreation Programming, Library Services, and more. The Academy is an annual project, held once a week in the evenings, and enrolls approximately 30 residents. 




Benefits of the Citizens' Academy
