


Background

- Danvers Town Manager Act 1949
- Consolidated responsibility and functions
- Town Manager given jurisdiction for maintenance, repair and construction of all buildings, including schools



Danvers Public Works Department

A full service department; \$70 million budget; four divisions

- General Maintenance: Buildings, streets, solid waste, Water Treatment & Distribution; Sewer, Grounds & Forestry
- Electric: Power distribution
- Engineering: Construction design & management
- <u>Business</u>: Utilities billing, Budget; and Purchasing.

Process:

∛ ₫Maintenance

- Town utilizes preventive maintenance program for all buildings;
- Building Systems work scheduled over 12 months (HVAC, electrical, etc.);
- Work order system utilized;
- Weekly Meetings to address issues w/contract cleaning and OPS problems;

B. Capital Repairs

- Annual Town meeting Building Improvements
 Warrant Article
- School Administration input provided to DPW
- Town Manager decides with DPW and School Superintendent input
- Selectmen sponsor the Article

Grounds/Street

- Fields and athletic facilities maintained by DPW
- DPW handles plowing as first priority

Townwide Contracts

- Cleaning;
- HVAC maintenance;
- Elevators;
- Cleaning supplies & paper products;
- Alarm systems

- Vehicle maintenance;
- Technology
