Federal Assistance Summary

- The federal government has authorized more than **\$5 T** in COVID-related spending, including most notably:
 - > \$2.2 T in the CARES Act
 - > \$900 B in CRRSA
 - > \$1.9 T in the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

Massachusetts Impact

- \$110 B in estimated value to Massachusetts families, businesses, and governments; equivalent to about 18 percent of the state's 2019 GDP
 - > \$71 B from COVIDrelated federal aid from previous federal legislation
 - > \$39 B allocated from ARPA

Massachusetts Impact

- Preliminary estimates suggest ARPA may direct more than \$39 B to Massachusetts
- **\$19.8 B** in direct funding to MA businesses, nonprofits, and individuals
- **\$19.5 B** in federal programs administered by or directed by the state

Commonwealth's Goals

- Maximize federal revenue available to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic
- Minimize compliance risks associated with applying federal resources to state or local uses

Key Considerations

- Eligible uses
- Covered period
- Resource availability
- Reporting requirements
- Documentation
- Subrecipient management and monitoring responsibilities

Flow of Direct State and Local Aid Funding Figures in \$ billions

Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds

- \$4.5 B to the Commonwealth
- **\$3.4 B** to local governments
 - > **\$1.7 B** for municipalities larger than 50k people
 - > **\$368 M** for municipalities smaller than 50k people;
 - > \$1.4 B for counties
 - » \$942 M for nonfunctional counties
 - » \$395 M for functional counties



ARPA: Eligible Uses

Covered Period

Covered period begins
 March 3, 2021 and ends
 December 31, 2024

Prohibited Uses

- Use of funds to support state pension funds is prohibited
- Use of funds to offset tax reductions is prohibited

Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds

- **1.** Respond to the public health emergency with respect to COVID-19 or its negative economic consequences
- 2. Provide *premium pay to public employees* providing essential work during the COVID-19 pandemic
 - Defined as additional pay up to \$13/hour as designated by Governor or chief executive
- **3.** Provide government services to the extent of the *reduction in revenue* due to COVID-19
- 4. Invest in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure



Outstanding Issues

Next Steps

- Receive program guidance related to state and local aid from the US Dept of Treasury
- Determine the scope of new potential uses
- Evaluate current uses in the context of both existing and new sources of revenue
- Refine compliance strategy based on new rules and regulations

ARPA Changes Everything

- Significant new funds will be available to support an array of policy areas (childcare, transportation, housing, etc)
 - Integrating these new sources into our strategic efforts will take time
- Municipalities and school districts will receive significant new assistance from the federal government
- Compliance remains critical



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
