Note: For many Jewish and Islamic holidays, the observance typically begins at sundown on the day before the holiday. Many Jewish holy days end one hour after sunset on the concluding day, whereas Islamic holy days typically depend on the sighting of the moon and Hindu holidays are usually determined by a combination of luni-solar calendar, regions and sects. Additionally, a number of religious traditions observe fasting during specific times.
