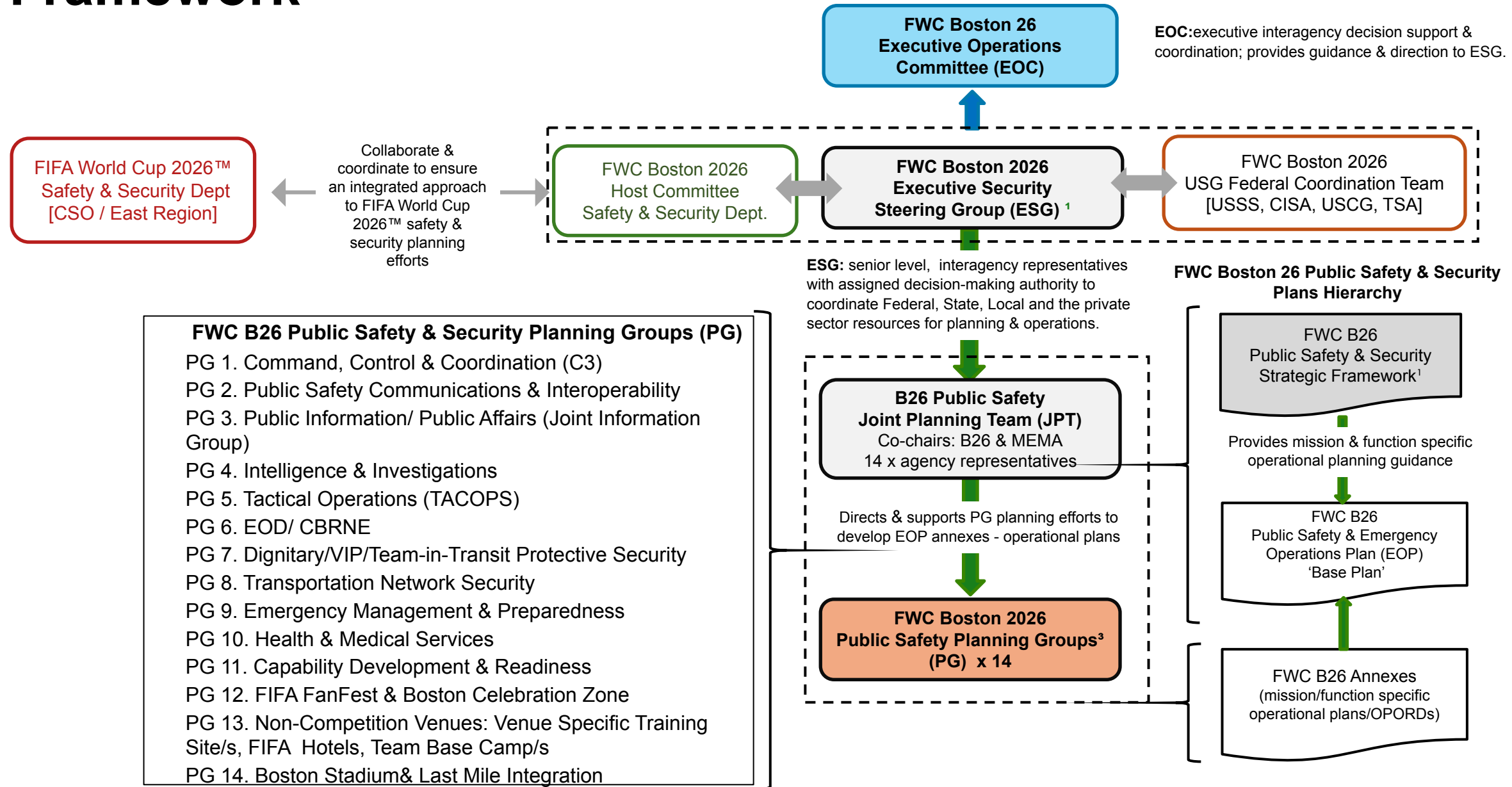
## Key Upcoming Deadlines & Milestones: What to look out for?

- FWC B26 Public Safety & Security Plans due from the 14 working groups – (April 30).
- EOPSS coordinating a meeting with the consuls of the 7 nations playing matches at Boston Stadium, along with the 3 host nations – (May 4th).
- Operation Red Card training focused on public safety roles and responsibilities for game day operations – (May 20).
- MEMA is leading a World Cup 2026 Task Force with the National Emergency Management Association focused on complex emergency management issues associated with the tournament – (ongoing).
- The PIO Planning Group, led by EOPSS and MEMA, is finalizing a scalable

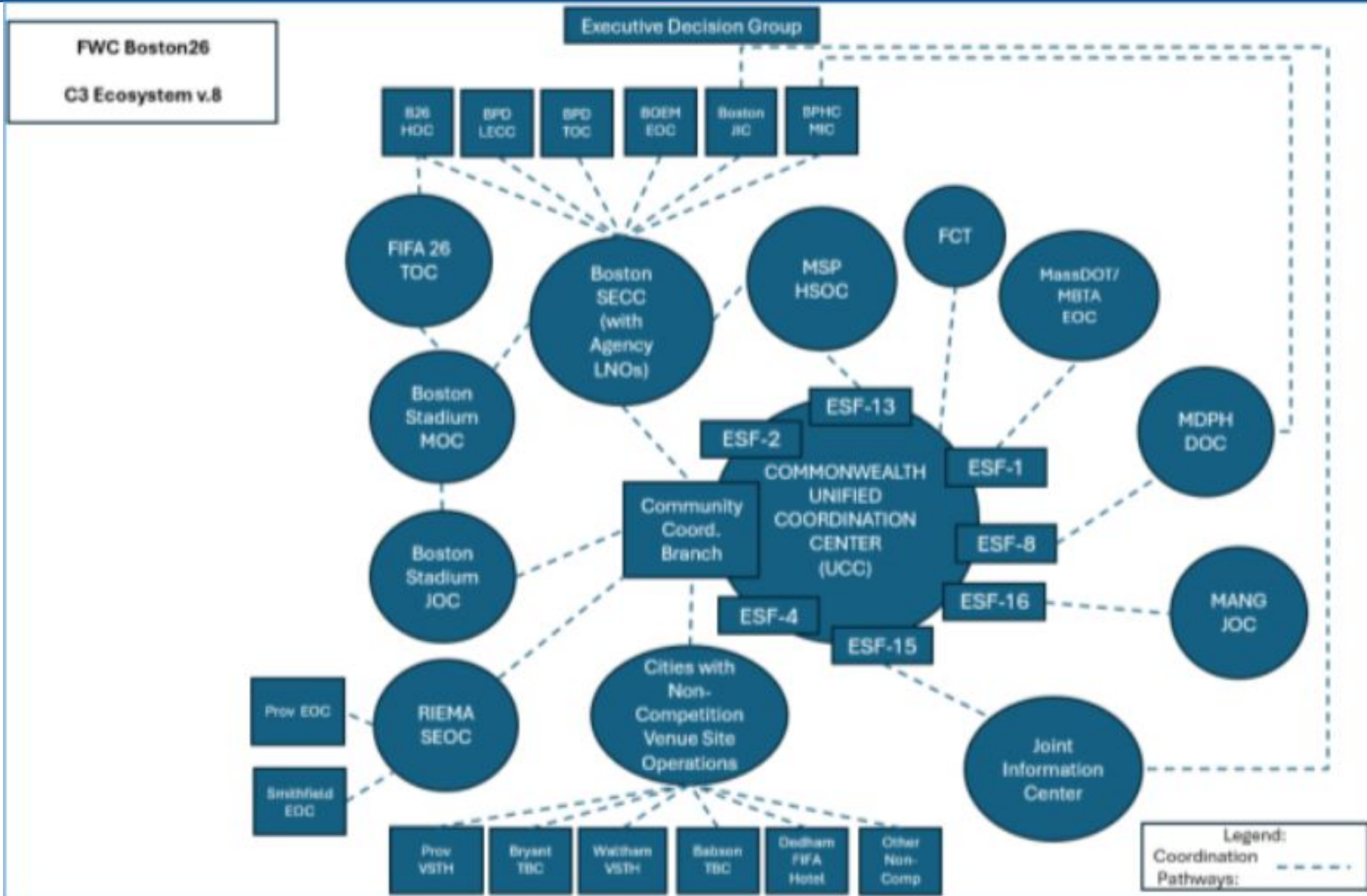
## Our World Cup-Related Work in Your Communities

- 5 major exercises conducted or supported to rehearse emergency scenarios and operation coordination

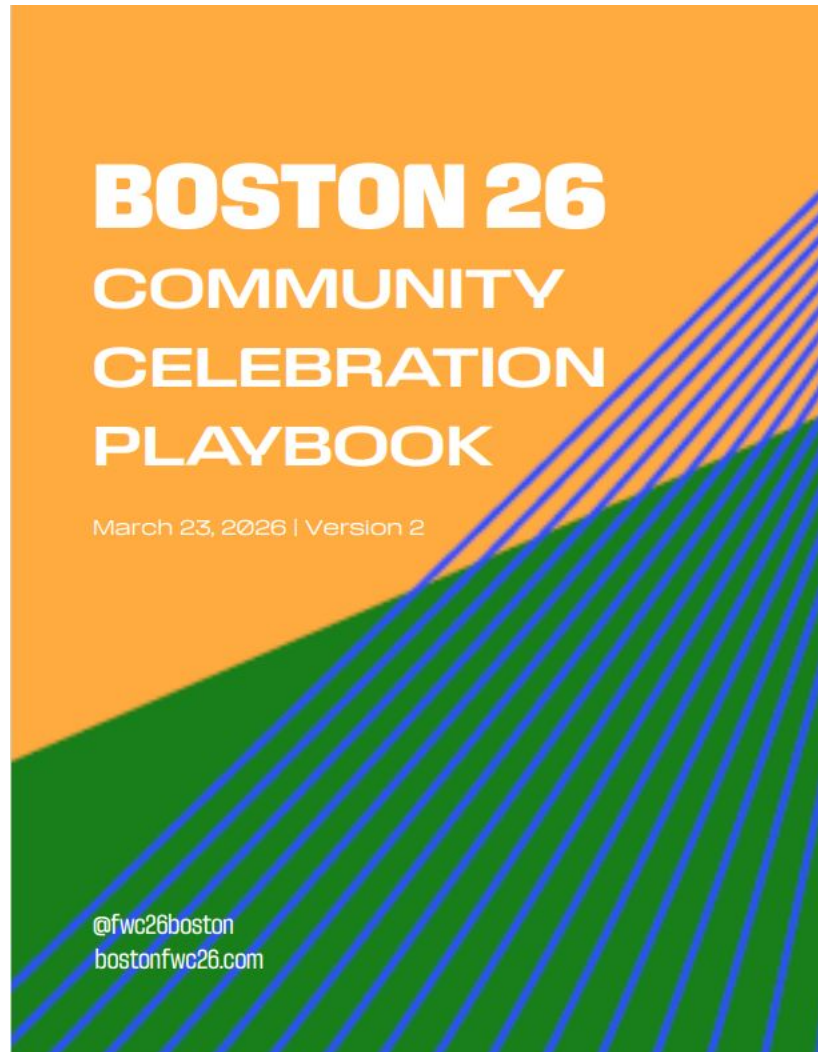
# FWC Boston 26 Public Safety & Security Governance Framework

## Key Upcoming Deadlines & Milestones: What to look out for?

- A coordinated Human Trafficking Preparedness Plan to proactively address risks related to sex and labor trafficking.
- Grounded in trauma-informed and survivor-centered principles, the Plan strengthens cross-agency collaboration across four pillars—**Prevention, Training, Response, Public Awareness, and Victim Services**—to enhance statewide readiness, protect vulnerable populations, and uphold human rights during this major international event.

## Our World Cup-Related Work in Your Communities:

- Distribution of sex and labor trafficking awareness materials in hotels, restaurants, and public-facing restrooms
- Placement of trafficking awareness materials across public transportation systems
- Increased human trafficking training for:
  - First responders (law enforcement, firefighters, EMTs, and public and private ambulances)
  - Transportation personnel
